

GREENBELT IMPROVEMENTS

On March 11, 2010 the Board of Directors approved a number of landscaping projects for the greenbelt.

Beginning in March Landscape Care will be installing header boards and infill with dust base rock around the bases of the light fixtures and benches. This will provide a clean, consistent look throughout the greenbelt.

At **Arrowwood Ct.** we will remove the 3 failing plum trees and grind stumps, re-level, and seed grass. In that same area, we will remove the Junipers and Pyracantha, mow the ivy and let it grow back.

At the **West Entrance** to the greenbelt we will add a layer of mixed cobbles in the half moon bed under the fence.

At **Wildberry**, we will remove the Pyracantha and one Eucalyptus tree, add irrigation, plant 10 Nandina plants and 5 Floral Carpet Roses.

At **Clear Creek to Sheepberry, Deerberry to River Ash, Sweetbriar to Winterberry, Striped Maple to Corkwood and Lawson to Sweet Shrub** we will remove the Junipers or Pyracantha and let the ivy infill. Mulch added as needed.

At **Black Walnut Ct.** we will reset the meter boxes to grade and install header board, infill with dust base rock. Add 3 large moss rocks.

In the central area, at the three circular areas, remove 2 inches of soil from the beds and add a layer of mixed cobbles.

Throughout the greenbelt we stump grind all existing stumps or as many as possible – not to exceed \$2,200.

At the end of **Barberry Ct.** we will remove and dispose of Juniper, upgrade existing irrigation in Jasmine bed, plant 29 one-gallon Star Jasmine and add a layer of clean mulch.

Between **Black Walnut and Marsh Elder** we will remove all vegetation, upgrade existing irrigation, plant 3 Crape Myrtle, 7 Pittosporum tenuifolium (Irene Patterson), 15 Floral Carpet Rose, 13 Nandina and add a clean layer of mulch.

At the East Pool:

Outside of fence: remove turf and undesirable vegetation located between Canoe Birch and Sugarland Ct.

Along fence line: remove turf on the north side of pool. Cap portions of the rotor head valve zone and convert the existing spray system to micro-sprays to water area outside of pool fence and newly created bed along fence between Sugarland and Canoe Birch. Install a decomposed granite base in the triangle area in sidewalk and north and east portion of the pool where one picnic table exists and another table will be installed. Install 6 moss rocks in various locations.

Along the inside of the north and east fence of the pool: plant 27 Nandina.

Along the fence line area between Canoe Birch and Sugarland: plant 2 flats Festuca, 9 Floral Carpet

Roses, 9 Aucuba, and a fresh layer of cedar mulch in the beds.
